Workers in the tourism sector could be jobless within days as hotels risk going out of business due to the effects of Covid-19. "Things are really bad. The human resource will be the most affected. If in the next three to six months nothing changes, then it will automatically be a complete shutdown. However, the tourism industry expressed disappointment, noting that despite the relaxed measures, the sector is still staring at zero bookings.

"We had expected him to say let us get ready for reopening by this date. Instead, he said we wait another 30 days to see whether there will be improvements but over that period, the numbers will be going up in 30 days," said Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers Chief Executive Mike Macharia.

"Whatever he has said does not work for the tourism industry. We are not asking for a reopening; we are asking for a more predictable schedule."

He said many hoteliers are running out of options to keep employees. "He has told everyone else to go back to work except for tourism. We cannot go back to work without clients who are locked in Nairobi and Mombasa as well as the region and overseas," said Macharia.

However, bar operators are set to continue suffering after the president extended their closure for a further 30 days. "The ban on all forms of gatherings, including but not limited to political gatherings, social gatherings, including bars be and is hereby extended for a further 30 days," said President Kenyatta.

•There is no tourism, stay at home. Travel when it is safe, Kenya Tourism Federation chair Mohammed Hersi says.

"There is no tourism, stay at home. Travel when it is safe," Kenya Tourism Federation chair Mohammed Hersi said.

KAHC chief executive Mike Macharia has called on industry players and the general public to cooperate in curbing the spread of the virus, which has almost paralysed key sectors of the economy.

"The industry(tourism) has shut down just like any other sector save for a few manufacturers and farmers. Let us contain the virus first then we cant think business later," Macharia told the Star.

The Kenya Tourism Research Institute (TRI) is currently conducting a study on the impact of coronavirus on the country's tourism sector.

"Tourism is hurt but it is early to tell the impact. However, some players might not be able to come back and those who are able might need a lot of support. We are looking into all these and how we will bring back the sector to life once we contain the virus," TRI acting CEO David Gitonga told the Star.

The Kenya Association of Travel Agents (KATA) has urged both domestic and international tourists to reschedule their travel plans to a later date "when things go back to how they were", instead of canceling.

"It is vital to be considerate of the sector that ranges from transportation, food, and beverage, entertainment, among other connected industries, and the impact of a cancellation on all these players," KATA said in a statement. **DATE :** 08/04/2020

On self-quarantine, Kagwe sought to clear the air by stating that it has been ongoing over years. He clarified that the government cannot take a whole village or town and keep them secluded.

The billions of shillings the tourism industry earns the country are at stake as Kenya takes radical measures. This is coupled with cancellations by guests who planned to travel but have since changed their mind.

"We have to support the government's efforts. From a business point of view, it is going to slow down the economy. We have already seen a number of cancelations in Nairobi, Malindi and Mara. Some places are yet to be affected but we are evaluating on a daily basis to see the exact impact," he said.

The industry is a leading foreign exchange earner for Kenya. The sector earnings reached Sh163.5 billion in 2019, according to data by the Ministry, from 2.05 million tourists who visited the country last year.

This, she added, is the reason why the aviation and travel industry has a bleak future as no revenue is streaming in.

"Some airlines like South African Airways and Virgin Australia are going through insolvency. If airlines do not receive support from their national governments, they will go bankrupt," Ms. Mucuha said.

She called upon government and corporates to pay up pending bills owed to travel agents to allow their businesses to survive the crisis. The government owes the travel industry over Sh.400 million for ticket sales over the past two fiscal years.

"There are some companies that will not survive the coronavirus pandemic. The government needs to support these businesses. Instead of closing shop, these businesses can partner or form mergers for survival and later make a comeback post Covid-19," she advised.

Travel agents, she continued, may have to rethink their business strategy and cease extending credit in future for business sustainability.

Boinett assured the travel industry that the government is processing the payments for the pending bills owed and that the payments shall be settled soon.

On human resource matters, the Kenya Association of Hotel Keepers and Caterers (KAHC) CEO, Mike Macharia talked about the options businesses have with their staff which are within the law. These include paid and unpaid leaves, and pay reductions, all of which, he emphasized, have to be agreed on by the employer and employee.

Billions of shillings that the tourism industry earns the country are at stake as most key source markets in Europe and Asia cut travel to Kenya.

The industry is already experiencing cancellations from guests who planned to travel, but have since changed their minds, fearing travel will expose them to the virus.

The Government has also taken measures to keep the disease at bay including suspension of all international conferences slated to take place in Nairobi over the next one month as well as suspending flights from North of Italy and China. Kenya Airways yesterday said it is suspending flights to Rome, Italy.

While acknowledging such measures will hit the industry, players, however, note that this is necessary. Mike Macharia, the chief executive of Kenya Association of Hotel Keepers and Caterers (KAHC) told *The Standard* that the sector will have opportunities to regroup and forge ways to recover the time lost.

"From a business point of view, it is going to slow down the economy. We have already seen a number of cancellations ... but it is also a matter of public health concern. It is difficult to separate the two and say we are losing a lot of money and not think about the health of the people," he said.
